
Charting a Stronger Future for Massachusetts Rivers

2024 in Review

We are pleased to report that 2024 was a very strong year for Mass Rivers and river protection and restoration across the state.

-  We benefited from generous support from new and returning donors, allowing us to expand our reach and capacity - thank you!
-  We continued to advocate for our rivers on several fronts - with the legislature, with state and federal agencies, through the legal system, and by speaking up for rivers in decision-making spaces across the state. We were delighted to see our drought bill pass the Senate last year, along with increased state investments in river protection and restoration. We also saw both EPA's Region 1 and the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection take steps to protect streamflow, at our urging.
-  We created and launched a new, ambitious strategic plan to guide our work over the next five years. Please take a look (it's on the website); we look forward to working with you to achieve an even bigger impact towards a sustainable water future.
-  Our education programs continue to grow, and we are especially proud of Dam Busters 101, a year-long weekly series that attracted over 500 participants from around the state—and beyond—to learn about all aspects of dam removal.

As we look ahead to 2025, we believe our work at the state level is more important than ever. With federal leaders choosing to step back from safeguarding our environment, the state's role in ensuring healthy rivers, clean water, environmental justice, and climate resilience will be critical to our future. While we recognize that challenges lie ahead, we note that rivers persist and adapt, and so do we. Mass Rivers is uniquely positioned to address these challenges. We will continue to let our long-term strategic priorities guide our work, while remaining nimble and flexible as we adapt to the changing federal landscape. Our Achievements

Our new 2025-2030 Strategic Plan provides a path to water sustainability in Massachusetts, with a focus on climate resilience.

We are proud to have achieved most of what we set out to do in our 2019 Plan and we have set more ambitious goals for the next five years.

Called upon the EPA to use its legal authority under the Clean Water Act to require stronger state protection for streamflows.

As a result of our Notice of Intent to sue the EPA, filed jointly with partners, the EPA formally requested that MassDEP improve its streamflow protections.

Despite a tough budget year, we helped secure over \$14 million in increased investment in state agency programs that protect our rivers and do critical work to improve climate resilience, environmental quality, and public health and safety.



Sustaining rivers and water supplies during drought.

Together we moved our top legislative priority, “The Drought Bill” (H.861/S.475) one important step closer to becoming law - it passed the Senate! We will continue to advocate for this bill in 2025 to strengthen drought management across the state and better prepare us to weather future droughts.

Last session, our timely intervention stopped several harmful legislative initiatives that would have harmed water quality and sustainability.

We strongly opposed one end-of-session amendment that would have weakened the Interbasin Transfer Act, one of the state’s foundational water management laws, that enables housing and growth by ensuring that local water management is sustainable. We successfully advocated for its deletion from the final version of a bill that eventually passed.

Continued to connect and strengthen our 80+ member groups

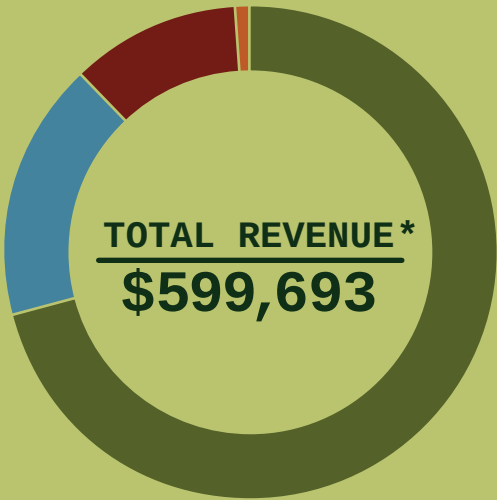
with monthly and bimonthly peer-to-peer “Mass Rivers Connects” virtual meetings with topics including water quality monitoring, water policy strategizing, running a small organization, and environmental justice.

We represented water interests on 30+ committees, commissions, task forces, and advisory groups.

We used these opportunities to improve river protection in Massachusetts, and to make sure rivers were considered in drought management, stormwater control, climate resilience, biodiversity, water infrastructure funding, and water allocation.

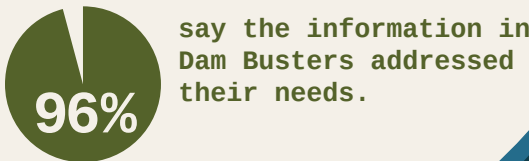
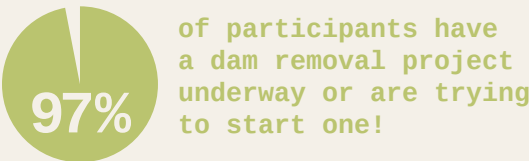
Mass Rivers has historically spent very little on fundraising, but in 2024 we invested in that area for the first time in order to increase our growth. Expenditures reflect the cost of a new foundation fundraising program, and dedicated staff support for our development, engagement, and public outreach.



Dam Busters

We taught over 500 people about dam removal to accelerate the pace of dam removals in Massachusetts.

Our year-long monthly webinar series, Dam Busters 101, connected 500+ participants representing 155 towns across MA with dam removal experts across multiple disciplines.



Mass Rivers Information + Member Organization Action = Dam Busting for Free Flowing Rivers

Since the 19th century, the beautiful Housatonic River in western Massachusetts and its plethora of tributaries have hosted many industrial mills on their banks, including grist mills that turned grain into flour. The grist is gone, but the dams remain, and many are in poor condition, blocking fish passage, affecting water quality, and posing public safety problems.

One of these dams, conveniently named the Grist Mill Dam, has recently undergone a reckoning. Located near Pittsfield, MA the dam prevents fish from traveling upstream for spawning, could be contributing to river health issues, and no longer serves a utilitarian purpose. Traditionally, the Berkshire Environmental Action Team (BEAT), a Mass Rivers member organization, has limited their work on dam removal to the arduous task of gathering support from the community. But, for the first time, they have jumped in to take on a full dam removal project to dismantle the Grist Mill Dam, and the Dam Busters webinar series has been right there to help.

BEAT’s Executive Director, Jane Winn, got the project started after the dam’s owner approached her for help, demonstrating the importance of local NGOs in leveraging community relationships to raze dams while building climate resilience. When it was determined that the dam should come down, BEAT began designing the dam removal project, working with the Town of Pittsfield to apply for grant funds. According to Jane, her staff repeatedly used the Dam Busters recorded webinars as reference tools that were “extraordinarily helpful” in getting this project set up. Their plan became the basis of a successful grant application. Funds were awarded by the Massachusetts Division of Ecological Restoration in January of 2025. Thanks to BEAT’s initiative and resourcefulness, and the support of the Dam Busters webinars, one more defunct dam will disappear from the Housatonic.

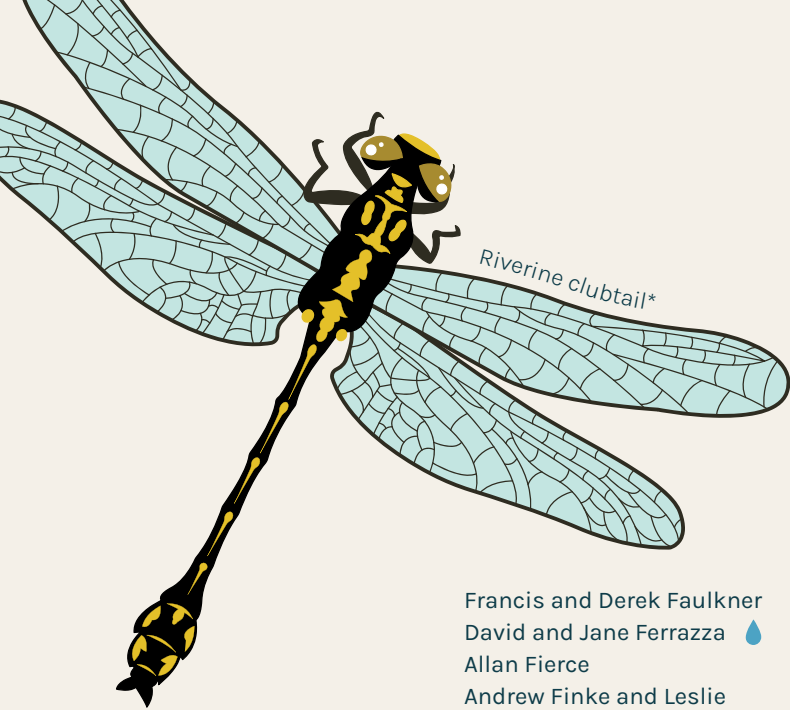

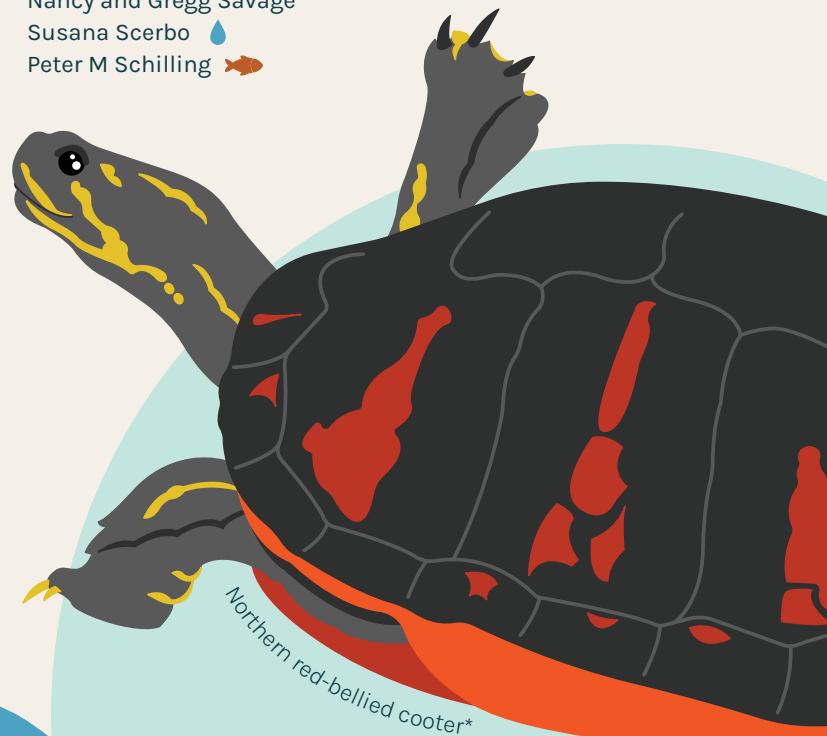
